In March 2020, Bethesda's Food Pantry, an agency of the Food Bank of Central & Eastern NC, closed as a result of the COVID19 pandemic. Due to major logistical obstacles, operational and procedural changes implemented by the Food Bank, new food storage requirements, and safety concerns, all of which are still in place today, we have been unable to reopen our pantry. We continue to remain in contact with the Food Bank, and have been reassured that the food needs of our community are being met by the pantries that have been able to remain open.

With that in mind, a group of Assistance Team volunteers decided to research and identify volunteer opportunities in our community. The information contained in this booklet, which is designed to be helpful but not overwhelming, is the result of our research. It represents only a sample of the many and varied volunteer opportunities that are available throughout Moore County.

Food Assistance

Food Bank of Central & Eastern NC (FBCENC), Sandhills Branch

The Sandhills Branch of the FBCENC currently supports approximately 15 partner agencies who distribute food throughout Moore County. Many of these agencies need additional volunteers to help with food distribution. Since each agency operates on specific days of the week/weekend and during certain times of day, please contact the Sandhills Branch at 910-692-5959 for information on volunteering for food distribution with a partner agency.

The Sandhills Branch also offers volunteer opportunities at their location, 195 Sandy Avenue, Southern Pines, including boxing food items for Back Pack Pals, Seniors boxes, as well as a variety of seasonal foods (produce, etc.), Capri Sun drinks, and sorting salvage from community food drives.

Meals On Wheels of the Sandhills

Meals on Wheels volunteers use their own vehicles to deliver hot lunch-time meals on weekdays to those who are homebound/in need throughout Aberdeen, Pinebluff, Pinehurst and Southern Pines. Volunteers pick up and deliver meals according to route sheets, then return containers to the kitchen, all of which takes about 1-2 hours. In addition to receiving a hot meal, the recipients enjoy treasured fellowship with caring volunteers.

Housing & Family Support

Family Promise of Moore County

The mission of Family Promise is to provide shelter, food and opportunity to homeless women and their children. The Shelter Program provides temporary housing for mothers and their children as they move towards to their goal of independent living.

In 2016, Family Promise purchased a home located at 400 Saunders Boulevard in Aberdeen, with 5 bedrooms, 6.5 baths, kitchen facilities, living/play spaces, and Family Promise offices. The shelter is supported by volunteers from 15 area congregations (including Bethesda Presbyterian) and organizations. These volunteers perform a variety of duties including preparing an evening meal, spending time in fellowship with the families, and spending the night to ensure the comfort and safety of all.

The mission of Friend to Friend is “to help survivors of domestic violence, sexual assault, and human trafficking rebuild their lives.” Serenity House provides 24-hour staff oversight as well as a pet shelter, where clients heal and rebuild their lives with the help, assistance, and necessary support of Friend-to-Friend staff, coupled with a variety of optional programming sessions.
