A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear brothers and sisters,

Holy Week is here; we have several services at Bethesda. On Maundy Thursday, we will reflect on Jesus' last meal with his disciples, before his death, and the betrayal that takes place. On Good Friday, we will come to terms with the crucifixion of Christ. On Saturday, the sanctuary will be open for silent prayer in memory of that Sabbath silence after the Lord was buried. Then, on Easter day, we will have a sunrise and regular service celebrating Jesus' resurrection from the tomb.

All of this draws us close to the heart and soul of the Gospel: the death and resurrection of Jesus of Nazareth.

The hope is not only that we will remember a story that happened a long time ago, even if it is a very important story. The hope, you might say, is that these service will "put us there" or relocate us into what one theologian called "the strange world" of the Bible.

So prepare yourself because you may find yourself. You may find yourself in the impetuousness or perhaps sleepiness of Peter. If you are honest, you may even find a nearness to Judas, Pilate, or the religious leadership that judged Jesus. You may identify with the fickle crowd or with the lone Mary Magdalene.

This Holy Week, wherever you find yourself in the strange world of the Bible, know that Jesus Christ is working, through his Spirit, rooting out the sin in your life and giving you a new sanctified self–one that can go back into our world with the lifegiving love of God.


