A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear friends

On October 15, I preached a sermon entitled "Rejoice, again, I say Rejoice," citing the Apostle Paul's admonition in Philippians. This was the lectionary text that week, and it seemed providential because at the same time I had a clear sense for nearly a month that I should be praying for "spiritual joy" at Bethesda. After the sermon, several of you reached out to me and wanted to talk about the message. I usually don't give out that many copies of a sermon. And, truth be told, I didn't think it was a good one. The point is, the need for real joy also seemed to be pressing on the hearts and minds of many of the members here at Bethesda.

Now, Presbyterians don't usually talk about being prophetic—unless it relates to activism, social justice, or the Old Testament. However, it seems to me that the pressure and resonance the community is feeling around Paul's call to "rejoice" might very well be a prophetic word to us. In other words, we have had not just a lesson or teaching on joy but an *in-sight* into what God has to say to us today.

Of course, it is an odd time for the Church to receive a call to rejoice. When one looks at the world and hears of war and rumors of war, not to mention our many domestic problems, it feels insensitive to seek joy. Perhaps we should weep. Perhaps we should feel righteous indignation, and maybe we do allow ourselves to weep and be justly angry in times like these.

I want to encourage you, however, to be open to praying for "spiritual joy" for yourself, Bethesda, and others. After all, there are times and a time may yet come when it is very difficult to find the false consolations of the world meaningful, and, in those times, we need to know existentially and be prepared fully to share the joyful good news of Jesus Christ.







Local History

Rebecca Bethune Kelly Shaw

Rebecca Bethune Kelly Shaw lived an interesting life. She was born in Moore county on January 6, 1829 to Peter Kelly and Catherine McIntosh Kelly. The Kelly and McIntosh families of northern Moore County emigrated from the Isle of Skye in Scotland in the . Ms. Shaw was one of eleven children born to Pat Kelly and his wife. She attended the Floral College for Women where she was an exceptional mathematician. She married Peter Cornelius Shaw on December 22, 1853. The Shaws, in time, moved back to Moore County and became members of Bethesda Presbyterian Church. Rebecca Shaw was co-President of the Women's Missionary Society of Bethesda Church. Ms. Shaw died November 20, 1907 at the age of 78. A the time of her death, she was the last Charter Member of Carthage Presbyterian Church. Her sister, Mrs. Flora McLean died two days later. She is buried beside her husband directly in front of Old
