# **Youth and Family Ministry Programs**

Bethesda offers programs for the spiritual growth of the whole family.

Family Fun Night The first Sunday of the month from 4:30-6:30 pm. This family Bible Study is perfect for families with children pre-K through 5th grade. It includes dinner, music, games, and crafts.

Faith Weaving Friends This program brings together 2nd-5th graders every third Friday of the month from 5:30-7 pm. It includes fellowship over dinner, Bible study, and fun!

Bethesda Youth Group (BYG) Geared toward 6th-12th grade students, BYG meets some Sundays from 5-7 pm (check the calendar for exact dates). Each meeting includes dinner, recreation, and a Bible Study. **NOTE:** The Youth Group is looking for adult leaders to help plan & lead activities. Men of the Church Gathering quarterly on the first Thursday of the month, Men of the Church enjoy fellowship over dinner, a devotion, and discuss mission, outreach, and congregational support opportunities. Check the church calendar for meeting dates and times.

**Sunday School Classes** meet at 10 am on Sundays after the breakfast hour.

- Nursery (Ages 0-2) Our youngest learners enjoy time in the nursery reading books, singing songs, and learning through play and exploration.
- Lower Elementary (Ages 3 Kindergarten) Utilizes curriculum to teach foundational Bible knowledge. Children enjoy activities, crafts, games, and imaginative play to learn and reinforce lessons.
- **Upper Elementary** (1-5 Grade) Utilizes age appropriate Sunday School lessons while keeping children engaged through crafts, games, and fun.
- Junior and Senior High (6-12 Grade) Studies different books of the Bible, comparing and contrasting stories and characters.
- Parlor Class Studies different books of the Bible as well as theological books to gain a deeper understanding of the Word, how it applies to the world today, and to strengthen faith.
- Jesse Wimberly (Adult) Utilizes The Present Word curriculum series to facilitate instruction and discussion.
- The Seekers (Adult) Currently studying the Gospel of John, this class studies and discusses how they can apply God's Word together.
- Jonah Study The first few weeks of Sunday School 2024, Pastor David will lead an in-depth class on Jonah during the Sunday School hour. All are invited to attend.

# **Evangelism**

### The Heidelberg Catechism Study

In the first four questions (Part 1, Our Misery) we discussed why we should be comforted in our sin and misery. With the fifth question we began Part 2 of the Heidelberg Confession, **Our Deliverance**. We spent little time (four of fifty-two days) on our sin and misery because "there is nothing to be gained." Furthermore, spending too much time is both discouraging and depressing and the Catechism is about comfort.

In the first four questions, we have drawn a scriptural picture of "man", who is unable, ON HIS OWN, to do "anything good and is an heir to eternal death." Part 2 of the Heidelberg Confession (and the Bible) are about delivering us from Sin and Misery. According to the dictionary, Deliverance means the act of "setting free, liberating, rescuing, saving from someone or something. "As such, the Catechism, like the Bible, places the emphasis not on ourselves, but on God's grace in our Savior, Jesus Christ.

The Catechism began with "How can we escape this punishment and be received in favor again." Part 2 is about answering that question.



Faith Presbyterian Church, on Bethesda Avenue in Aberdeen, was established near the site of an old Black burial ground on land obtained for the church by Malcolm M. Blue (1802-1872). The congregation formed shortly after the American Civil War by Black worshipers who no longer wished to attend services at the nearby Old Bethesda Church. Initially referred to as the Blue Crossing Church, the present structure was completed in in the late 1800's. The churchyard cemetery contains the graves of some of Faith's earliest members. Friends of Faith, Inc., a non-profit corporation, began in 1993 to preserve and protect the property and its history in response to the dissolution of the congregation. Bethesda church members, former Faith church members, and community representatives constituted the original Board of Directors. The Board is in the process of being reconstituted to continue their work. The building will be used for: Worship services for congregations in African American Christian traditions; informational and educational programs; periodic historic public viewings; and other programs approved under the direction and auspices of the Board of Directors. More history will be given in future articles as will information on how you can donate to the project.

# Stephen Ministry Theology



The theology of the Stephen Ministry team is found in Ephesians 4:12-13: "to equip Saints for the work of Ministry, for building up the body of Christ until all of us come to the unity of the faith and the knowledge of the son of God, to maturity to measure of the full stature of Christ." The Stephen Ministry is a team effort. The members of the team are the Pastor, Stephen Ministry Team Leaders, and Stephen Ministers.

**Pastor**: provides the leadership and oversight of the God-honoring lay ministry and supports the Stephen Leaders in their activities.

**Stephen Leaders**: are the mission-focused leaders, who make the highly effective lay ministry happen by coordinating activity, training and continuing education of Stephen Ministers, as well as working with the Pastor to select "Care Receivers".

**Stephen Ministers**: are the "Care Givers" who minister to those in need, the "Care Receivers".

The Stephen Leaders and Stephen Ministers are commissioned by the Congregation, through the Pastor. The commissioning is for two years and takes place after ten-plus weeks of training. The commissions are renewable given: "the individual's desire to stay active, remaining current through continuing education, and overall performance." November will see the commissioning of our new Stephen Leader, Dan Wiener, and the recruiting/selection of a new group of potential Stephen Ministers for training after the first of the year.

On November 10th we will commission Dan Wiener as our Steven Ministry Leader and Coordinator at the 11 o'clock worship service.
