A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear friends and members of Bethesda,

Ash Wednesday is around the corner and Lent is almost here. Historically this is a time in which the Church prepares itself for the Easter celebration of Jesus' resurrection from the dead. Usually the Church would take this time to prepare baptismal candidates, encourage people to fast and pray, and to meditate on the Gospel account of Christ's journey toward the Cross.

All this is good and right. And, yet, nevertheless, there is the question whether we can truly prepare for Easter. If God offers us life beyond what's imaginable, then can we really prepare for it?

The original disciples were certainly not prepared for Jesus Christ to rise from the dead, especially after his crucifixion. Even though Christ told them repeatedly that He would die and rise, even though they followed Him, the disciples were still not ready for the great surprise of resurrection.

Right now, as we move into Lent, I encourage you to pray, fast, read Scripture, reflect on your mortality and baptism. I encourage to do whatever you can to live faithfully in this season. However, I also want you to be open to the possibility that what God is doing might not be something you can expect or prepare for at all. This Easter season, the God of Jesus Christ may work something within your life in a way that will be a surprise.

Youth and Family Ministry Programs

Bethesda offers programs for the spiritual growth of the whole family.

Family Fun Night The first Sunday of the month from 4:30-6:30 pm. This family Bible Study is perfect for families with children pre-K through 5th grade. It includes dinner, music, games, and crafts.

Faith Weaving Friends This program brings together 2nd-5th graders every third Friday of the month from 5:30-7 pm. It includes fellowship over dinner, Bible study, and fun!

Bethesda Youth Group (BYG) Geared toward 6th-12th grade students, BYG meets some Sundays from 5-7 pm (check the calendar for exact dates). Each meeting includes dinner, recreation, and a Bible Study. **NOTE:** The Youth Group is looking for adult leaders to help plan & lead activities. Adult Bible Studies Various Bible studies are offered throughout the year. Check our website for more info or contact the church office to receive notifications.

Presbyterian Women's Circles Our women's Bible Study groups meet monthly from September to May. Bethesda offers four women's circles that meet on various days and times. Please see page 9 for all the details and contact information.

Men of the Church Gathering quarterly on the first Thursday of the month, Men of the Church enjoy fellowship over dinner, a devotion, and discuss mission, outreach, and congregational support opportunities. Check the church calendar for meeting dates and times.

Sunday School Classes meet at 10 am on Sundays after the breakfast hour.

- **Nursery** (Ages 0-2) Our youngest learners enjoy time in the nursery reading books, singing songs, and learning through play and exploration.
- **Lower Elementary** (Ages 3 Kindergarten) Utilizes curriculum to teach foundational Bible knowledge. Children enjoy activities, crafts, games, and imaginative play to learn and reinforce lessons.
- **Upper Elementary (**1-5 Grade) Utilizes age appropriate Sunday School lessons while keeping children engaged through crafts, games, and fun.
- **Junior and Senior High** (6-12 Grade) Studies different books of the Bible, comparing and contrasting stories and characters.
- **Parlor Class** Studies different books of the Bible as well as theological books to gain a deeper understanding of the Word, how it applies to the world today, and to strengthen faith.
- **Jesse Wimberly** (Adult) Utilizes *The Present Word* curriculum series to facilitate instruction and discussion.
- **The Seekers** (Adult) Currently studying the Gospel of John, this class studies and discusses how they can apply God's Word together.

Youth Update

Do you realize two months of the year have already ended and now we enter March and hoping means warmer days and longer days of daylight. In two months, the Youth Sunday School class continues to read the book of Acts. So far, we have made it through the first 16 chapters. Instead of a synopsis of what we have read, I will give you a few questions/ thoughts to ponder for you can go and read it as well.

- 1. Who do the disciples choose to replace Judas? And how?
- 2. Did you know King David prophesied the coming of Jesus and what will happen? Read Ch. 2, as you read Acts do you notice that the disciples/apostles recite the Old Testament. This indicates the importance of reading and understanding the Old Testament.
- 3. Who is Gamiel?
- 4. Who was the first martyr? Who else was there?
- 5. What can we learn from Phillip and his teaching of the Ethiopian? How to tell others about Jesus? We might need to be more like Phillip.
- 6. How would you have responded if God told you like he did Ananias to go to Saul a known enemy to you? If you were one of the disciples when Saul was brought to you?
- 7. Do you find it hard to think God can use people like Saul to do his work?
- 8. Tabitha, a disciple: Why do you think Luke made sure he tells about her as well as the paralytic man?
- 9. Why do you think God used the vision of the blanket and animals to teach Peter?
- 10. Bar-Jesus: A false prophet. Are there any false prophets today?
- 11. What happened to Paul and Barnabas while they were in Lystra? Why did they not like it? Do we as a society behave like Lycaonian's? Worship people/idols?
- 12. After Paul was stoned? What did he do? Wat did the disciples do?

These are just a few questions to look at as you read, there is much more that Luke has wrote to us learn about. So, start reading, you might learn something new.

Also, mark your calendars for Saturday March 29, the next Henster Adventure. Clues to follow.

A little background: "The Heidelberg Catechism was written in 1563. Conceived originally as a teaching instrument to promote religious unity in the Palatinate, the catechism, in the form of questions and answers, soon became a guide for preaching as well. It is a remarkably warm-hearted and personalized confession of faith, eminently deserving of its popularity among Reformed churches to the present day."

The Heidelberg Catechism is composed of three parts: Misery, Deliverance and Gratitude. As we resume, we resume the questions we are in the Part Two-Deliverance. Please reflect upon and enjoy this most wonderful exploration of one of our church's foundational documents.



History Corner

Faith Presbyterian Church



WILLIAM JONES RANKIN AND WIFE

The second official pastor of Faith Church was William Jones Rankin. Dr. Rankin's mind turned toward the serious matters of religion at an early age. He became a Christian at age 16 and consecrated his life to the ministry. Born in Elmwood in Iredell Co. on July 1, 1862, Rankin grew up on a farm and started his schooling in Elmwood. He attracted the attention of his pastor who later moved to Salisbury and sponsored a young Rankin at a parochial school there for two years. He then did his preparatory work at Biddle University and later his College and Theological courses at Lincoln University where he earned his AB degree in 1889 and his STB and AM degrees in 1892. The degree of Doctor of Divinity was conferred by Biddle University in June, 1911.

On April 27, 1893 he married Miss Mattie Elizabeth Cooper. She was educated at Petersburg and happily entered into the plans of her husband. On completion of his work at Lincoln University, Rev. Rankin was called to the Presbyterian Church at Laurinburg which he served for two years. In 1894 he moved to Aberdeen to take up the work at Faith Church. The young couple realized the lack of facilities for education of Black children and began a school out of their home. There will be more on this influential couple next month.
